GATHERING

♣ Light a candle to help you focus this time as "God time."

[↑] Prayer of the Week

Healer God—In the name of Jesus of Nazareth, you healed the man who could not walk. He immediately leapt up and praised you. Heal our hearts and bodies, too, that we may spring to life with joy and praise to you. Amen.

CARING CONVERSATION

Take a moment to check in with each other or to use the questions below.

- Highs & Lows: What is one thing you saw today that brought you joy? What is one thing you saw today that was not joyful?
- Thinking About This Week's Story: The man who could not walk was healed by Peter. He immediately leapt with joy and praised God. How did you praise God today?
- **Getting Ready for Next Week's Story:** Jason invites Paul and Silas into his home to learn about God's love. What is one thing you learned today?

DAILY BIBLE READING

Read aloud from the DAILY BIBLE READING from the front. What do you want to remember from this reading?

PRAY TOGETHER

[⊕] Have each person finish this prayer: Dear God, thank you for [name one person you know is sick] Help them to feel better. Amen.

CLOSING

₱ If you used a candle, extinguish it as a sign of the end of the devotion time.

Prituals & Traditions: A Blessing to Share

Mark one another with the sign of the cross on each other's hands or forehead, and say, "You have been created with a loving heart. Go, help and care for others. Amen."
